The Light Signals (Detection of Offences) Devices Approval 2004

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 20(4) and (5) of the Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988 (a) (Speeding offences etc: admissibility of certain evidence) and having prescribed for the purposes of section 20 of that Act a device designed or adapted for recording by photographic or other image recording means the position of motor vehicles in relation to light signals (b), hereby approves as from 3rd November 2004 for the purpose of detection of offences specified in section 20(2)(e) of that Act the device known as RedGuard manufactured by Redspeed International Ltd of Kidderminster, Worcestershire.
